

Drama

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Introduction:

The Drama course covers a wide range of drama skills, strategies and styles, many of which you will be familiar with from your Year 8 work. You will be making drama performances, working with scripts and looking at effective drama strategies for exploring issues and ideas.

What will it be like:

You will learn to work effectively with others in your class in order to make and perform drama. You will learn to analyse and present scripts and communicate your ideas effectively to an audience. You will have your performance work evaluated and reported on frequently by your Drama teacher in order to ensure that your work progresses.

Areas of study will include:

- Exploring themes/issues and working from a stimulus.
- Areas of study include - set text, devised theatre, scripted performance.
- A written exam which covers your own work and the evaluation of a live performance.
- Final moderated performance exam.
